## CONVENTION '75: HISTORY IN THE MAKING

The 1975 National Libertarian Party convention will leave its mark upon the pages of history. Over four hundred people from as far away as Hawaii and Alaska attended the conventionat the Staler Hilton in New York City the week of August 21- September 1. Two hundred and fortyeight delegates from 38 states hammered out a new platform and nominated a Presidential and Vice-Presidential candidate.

Along with the business of the convention were many other activities. Workshops were given on Campaign mamagement, campus organizing, taxresistance, fund-raising, public speaking, etc. Panel discussions were held on the MidEast Oil crisis and Women's Liberation. Lectures were held on the Gold Standard and the Legalization of Drugs.

There were breakfast lectures by Mark Tier on the growing Libertarian movement in Australia, a debate between David Friedman and Robert Nozick on Anarchy, State and Utopia, D.T. Armentano on anti-trust, and Jeffrey St. John on the American vs. the French revolution.

All this was topped off with multi-media shows by John Doswell Studios, an original show "Trash" and a Sunday night Banquet speech by Murray Rothbard on the future of the Libertarian Movement.

Getting back to the business end of the convention, the LP's candidate for President is Roger L. MacBride of Virginia who cast the electoral vote for Hospers-Nathan in the 1972 election. The Vice-Presidential candidate is David Bergland of California, who is chairman of the organization attempting to get "None of the Above" placed on the California ballot.

There has been extensive revision of the LP platform and as soon as copies are ready I will obtain them from National. The results of the election for National party office are: Ed Crane- unopposed for Chair Andrea Millen- un opposed for vice-chair, Greg Clark-unopposed for secretary, Fran Youngstein, unopposed for Treasurer. The national executive members for our region (region 8) are David Long of Mass. and Lee Schubert of New York who won over Virginia Walker. Roger Macbride won the nomination on the first ballot: MacBride-142 Haroff-62 Riggs-34.

There will be a special convention held in New York for all members of the FLP to discuss the convention and make plans for '76. Notice will be going out shortly.
