Judicial Committee reports decision on challenge

In early February of 1995, then LPC Chair Kim Goldsworthy wrote to the Judicial Committee asking that group to resolve an alleged conflict between the State and National versions of the Statement of Principles. The Committee at that time consisted of Bruce Lagasse, Steve Alexander

and May Grigell.

On Monday, February 20, Brows Lagases delivered the Justicial Committee's decision before the deligances assembled at the LPC convention to Okahad. He prefixed the decision by recompling the adoption of the Statement of Principles by the Missoul and State organizations. Lagases pointed out that in 1972 the original Statement of Principles was adopted in the first Mistoual Convention.
