

I asked the class, "Wouldn't it be better if California decided how to spend its money on education, rather than give it to Washington DC and only get back half after enacting silly programs like 'no child left behind'?'

I gave Rick his \$20 back, adding, "Libertarians want you to keep the money you earn."

reporter that the play's cancellation might have more to do with Egan's finding an excuse to shut down the performance due to his previously having been denied free tickets to the play.

After the cancellation, Bradbury, perhaps best known as the author of Fahrenheit 451, a science fiction novel in which a government has outlawed all books and firemen burn them, addressed the audience from nis wheelchair, recounting his "Agent Egan" threatens Schulman's camera love for plays and movies. He invited everyone into the lobby, where he spent an hour commiserating with guests and signing autographs

When this reporter approached Egan for a photointerview, so he might explain why he'd closed the performance, Egan threatened to confiscate this reporter's camera on the claim that Egan worked as an undercover police officer. When asked to produce a badge or other official identification, Egan refused.

Dandelion Wine began performances at South Pasadena's Fremont Centre Theatre on September 29th, ending its run on November 11th.

Addendum: On December 4. Lissa Reynolds of the Fremont Centre Theater updated California Freedom editor Thomas M. Sipos on the incident, writing via email "I think it's in the appeal phase, after they dropped the majority of false claims."

That same day, I was wearing my Ron Paul T-shirt in Starbucks. A middle-aged guy in scruffy army green and a knit hat said, "Who's Ron Paul?" When I asked his major issue and he said "global warming," I thought I might be in trouble. But turns out he's a Republican dropout with a deep concern over our loss of liberty. 


