

Hornberger Cancels Presidential Exploratory Committee

Jacob G. Hornberger has announced the termination of his presidential exploratory committee and has canceled plans to seek the Libertarian Party presidential nomination.

"Since the formation of my presidential exploratory committee two months ago, it has become increasingly clear that it is impossible for me to operate simultaneously The Future of Freedom Foundation and a presidential exploratory committee.

Hornberger concluded that his only solution was either to take a full leave of absence from The Future of Freedom Foundation or terminate his presidential exploratory committee. "There's no point in doing both endeavors ineffectively," Hornberger said. "In the last two months, it has become clear to me that I must make a choice now, rather than later, between The Future of Freedom Foundation and the race."

Hornberger said, "This decision has been one of the most difficult ones I have ever made, but my foremost responsibility and loyalty is to The Future of Freedom Foundation,

which I founded ten years ago, and to the subscribers and donors who have supported the Foundation over the years. Therefore, while I have been very enthusiastic about the possibility of a Libertarian Party presidential bid, I have concluded that since a choice must be made, it is best for me to remain as president of The Future of Freedom Foundation rather than make the presidential race."

Hornberger said that all donations to his presidential exploratory committee are being returned 100% and that he personally will cover the administrative expenses for the two months that the committee has been operational. "This is my responsibility and no one else's," he said.

Hornberger expressed his gratitude to everyone who has expressed positive feedback on his prospective presidential bid. "I want to especially thank the members of the exploratory committee who have devoted so much time and effort to this endeavor."

Hornberger said that while he would remain neutral in the race for the Libertarian Party presidential nomination, he will support the party's eventual presidential nominee.

pposition to the proposed Sales tax increase for the libraries is growing. Three new developments are worth mentioning. 1) Our new member from Moraga, Tom Smith, has just formed the Moraga Taxpayer's Association. He spoke before the town council, as they were reconsidering Moraga's NO vote on the new library tax. Tom joined The Party last month but is already making a difference. Way to go Tom!!! 2) Concord Mayor Michael Pastrick wrote a beautiful Guest editorial in the Co. Co. Times on June 12th blasting The State for shifting property taxes 6 years ago (that previously funded local government) to the state. He writes; " The impact on local services is severe. The State has taken over \$2.5 million annually from the city of Concord with \$2 million of that in property taxes. Contra Costa County reports property tax losses of \$85 million per year. All jurisdictions in Contra Costa lose over \$100 million per year.... This is the year the state needs to face up to the fact that their surplus exists, for the most part, because local government is the only group that has not been made whole for the state takeaways of 1992-93."

3) Walt Lautenberger from Lafayette Taxpayers Association brought to our attention that those communities that have the highest library usage are also the richest and best educated. 

AYN RAND

The 1999 addition to the Literary Arts stamp series honors Ayn Rand, the author of the *Fountainhead* and *Atlas Shrugged*. Born Alissa Rosenbaum in St. Petersburg, Russia, Ayn Rand came to the U.S. in 1926 at the age of 21 and later became a U.S. citizen. Rand believed that a productive society is the result of individual freedom and effort. Her philosophy influenced all of her books and made her a controversial but respected author. The stamp art was illustrated by Nicholas Gaetano, who also illustrated book jackets for several recent editions of Ayn Rand's books.
