TUCCILLE URGES DEFEAT OF PROPOSITION NUMBER ONE

Jerry Tuccille, Free Libertarian Party candidate for governor, once again urged his fellow New Yorkers to vote "no" to State Proposition Number One, the Rail Preservation Bond Issue.

In a statement released today by his campaign headquarters, Tuccille alleged that the \$250 million state debt created by the proposition's passage would be "impractical, immoral and inflationary."

Continued the candidate: "After decades of Penn Centrals, Amtraks and BMTs, the inefficiency and stupidity of those who control our public transportation should be evident to all. To give another \$250 million to such manifest incompetents would be a mistake of the gravest magnitude."

Asked for his suggestions as to alternatives, Tuccille responded: "Consumers have few if any complaints about the quality of the shoes and cameras they purchase. The solution to the transportation crisis is to apply to transit the same principle that has resulted in our unprecedented material and technological abundance. That principle is the free market, where inventors, engineers and industrialists are allowed to meet consumer demand without the burden of anticompetitive controls and arbitrary regulations.

"The government monopoly on transportation must be broken. A bond issue can only entrench it. I strongly advise the voters of New York State to vote 'no' to Proposition Number One this Tuesday."
