Andrew Kolstee read a list of members of the State Committee who served in the 2020-2022 term and are no longer members of the State Committee.


William Cody Anderson issued closing remarks.

Legislative Affairs Committee Report:

The approach of the committee has been to read and respond to bills introduced in Albany in January for the spring session. We advocated for good bills and against bad bills in accordance with libertarian principles, in an effort to slow down the growth of terribleness of state government. This has a been a reactive approach.

The incoming state committee should evaluate the approach of this committee. Do we want to become more proactive vs reactive, and produce and promote a full legislative agenda early on, prior to the start of the legislative session, to possibly have an impact upon what bills are in introduced in January and what they might contain? If we develop a more holistic strategy, then we really need to have a state party platform in my opinion for us to use a guiding beacon.

Effectiveness of this committee could also be greatly enhanced through use of "Voter Voice" or a similar tool. The new state committee should ponder as to whether this annual cost (probably in the \$5,000 to \$8,000 per year range) would yield us valuable positive outcomes in both legislative performance and growth in the libertarian movement.
