- •As of August 22, we are on the ballot in the following: Alabama, Alaska, Arizona, Colorado, District of Columbia, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Mississippi, New Jersey, New Mexico, Nevada, North Carolina, North Dakota, Ohio, Rhode Island, Tennessee, Utah, and Wisconsin. We are waiting for confirmation in the states of Delaware and Oklahoma. In addition, strong petition drives are under way in California, Connecticut, South Carolina, South Dakota, and Wyoming.
- SELL THE STREETS! The deplorable and unsafe condition of bridges and certain highways in western PA serve only to point out the continuing stubidity of leaving the planning, building, and maintainence of crucially important transportation facilities in the hands of nepotists, ignoramuses, extortionists and other varied and sundry political hacks.
