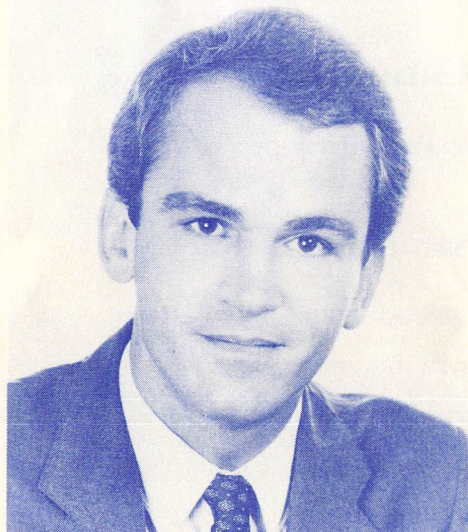

Our guest of honor and banquet speaker is John Northrup, the 1982 Libertarian Party candidate for Governor of New York.

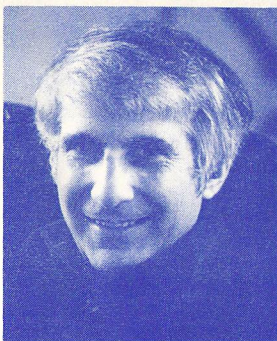

Anne Wortham received her Ph.D. from Boston College. Her book, *The Other Side of Racism*, is a study of how race consciousness is translated into public policy which violates individual rights and is her convention topic. PETER BREGGIN, M.D.

Peter Breggin is a practicing psychiatrist in Bethesda, Maryland and also serves as Executive Director of the Center for the Study of Psychiatry. Dr. Breggin is nationally known for his libertarian critiques of psychiatry and more recently for his commentaries on communicating libertarian philosophy. He is the author of numerous articles and five books including *Electroshock: Its Brain Disabling Effects*, and his most recent, *The Psychology of Freedom*.

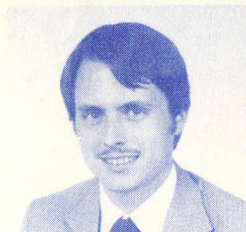

LEONARD LIGGIO

Leonard Liggio is one of the most highly regarded historians and scholars in the libertarian movement. He currently serves as President of the Institute for Humane Studies in Menlo Park, California and as the Editor of *Literature of Liberty*. He is the author of "Why the Futile

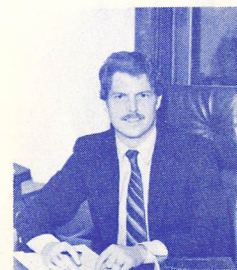
Crusade", and his articles appeared regularly in *Libertarian Review* where he served as Associate Editor, as well as in *Reason*, *Inquiry* and other publications. He will speak to the convention on current foreign policy approaches.



DOUG BANDOW

Following his undergraduate training in economics at Florida State where he was a Phi Beta Kappa, Mr. Bandow graduated from Stanford Law School. In 1981 he was appointed Special Assistant to President Reagan before leaving last summer to become Editor of *Inquiry* and Senior

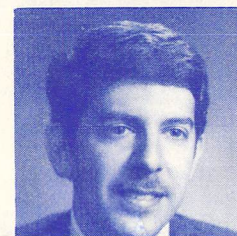
Policy Consultant at the Cato Institute. His work has appeared in *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *Christian Science Monitor*, *Reason*, *Conservative Digest*, and *Human Events* among numerous other publications.



CHRIS HOCKER

Chris Hocker has been active in the Libertarian Party since 1975. He served as National Director of the LP from 1977-79 and then became the National Coordinator of the Clark for President campaign. He was publisher of *Libertarian Review* and still serves as President of the Libertarian

Review Foundation as well as publisher of *Inquiry*.



DON FEDER

Following his graduation from Boston University Law School Don Feder practiced law in New York before becoming Executive Director of Citizens for Limited Taxation, the group which led the successful drive for Proposition 2½ in Massachusetts. In 1979 he became Executive Director

of the Second Amendment Foundation. Since last June he has published the newsletter *On Principle*. His convention topic is "Seven Myths of Gun Control."
