Los Angeles, Sat., Sept. 15th approximately 1:30 pm. Alert from Clark Marley. Channel 11 KTTV is airing a program "The New Dragnet" (MCA Universal; the Arthur Co.) Dumb de Dumb Dumb. The gist of the story line goes something like this :

Two police types are discussing some guy who "Talks like a Libertarian". some radical political, who should be wearing a "Brown Shirt". "Brown Shirts", of course being the hooligan supporters of Adolph Hitler in his rise to dictatorship. The story proceeds with the antics of some bigoted, power lusting, genuine 'bad guy'. He presents a "National Freedom Party" and is finally arrested for some deserving offense. End.

This is a blatant and cowardly attempt to associate Libertarianism with Fascist Nazism in the minds of the viewing public ! More than that, it is a consciously directed, smear tactic conducted as a trial balloon to see what can be gotten away with.

No political party in history has ever had the moral courage to uphold an explicit stance against the initiation of the use of physical force for the achievement of personal or social goals. The Libertarian party unequivocally does.

It's NOT a Libertarian Police Chief who advocates shooting drug users. Bush's "headsman" drug czar is NOT a Libertarian.

It's NOT Libertarians who advocate the redistribution of unborn children's earnings to pay for our social security.

It's NOT Libertarians who forcibly want to redistribute anyones earnings or property.

It's NOT Libertarians who advocate the Draft, Compulsory "free" Education or Concentration Camps for victimless 'criminals'.

In fact it's NOT Libertarians who advocate *compulsory anything* that can equate us with the likes of the Nazis, the Fascists or any other sort of Collectivism !

Channel 11 has presented each one of us with a rare chance to voice protest from our armchairs ! All we have to do is pick up the phone and tell them what we think and how we feel about this cheap shot directed against Libertarians. ## EDITOR

In roaming about a world where many of the faces one sees are marked by fear or distrust, it's a genuine reward to associate with Libertarians who, despite their differences have the courage to not only strive for their personal autonomy, but are willing to share that with others. I am honored by the opportunity and challenge involved with being your newsletter editor.

Both before and since my acceptance as editor a good deal of advice has been offered. I encourage that. In lieu of any positive response I intend to partially measure my success by criticism received and encourage that as well. The advice has ranged from "grab the bull by the horns" type to suggestions that the stance of 'production editor only' is most appropriate. Admonishments that potentially divisive issues might best be avoided have been offered as well. Some fear the idea of your opportunity to express your opinion through 'publishment guaranteed' paid letters to the editor. I DO believe that a strong and multifaceted newsletter is vital to our goals.

A large part of the alleged power of the press exists only in the minds of readers who doubt their ability to objectively assess the information and views presented, and suspect or fear that others are likewise limited. Who among us would not regard such a view as an insulting affront to their moral or mental integrity? Strong words perhaps but I earnestly believe that anyone who embraces the Libertarian ethic is a cut above that. You might suspect that the most effective and prevalent way to manage the news or public opinion is to ignore or evade the facts and issues. Ask any Libertarian candidate for office or advocate of issue solutions for examples of just that. As another example witness the level of controversy in our various media compared to those foreign nations who heartily fear, even more than they despise—a free press. Media control is their first and overriding concern.

The pamphleteers of the French and American revolution's and organs like Franklin's "Poor Richards Almanac" or Paine's "common Sense" were fodder for the firebrands of change. Given the diverse polarity of their contents it should be recognized that none of these were without competition or mere insipid hype sheets. For better or worse most of them were closely controlled as well. The heyday of America's 'yellow journalism' for all it's alleged sensationalism served the cause of liberty as no other media institution before or since.

With such in mind I take the op-

portunity to ask: what's your idea of effective activism? Is a new activism in order? Or would an enhanced version of the familiar serve? Public demonstration perhaps? Precinct work? Maybe public contact work such as Jim Lewis so ardently pursues on campus or the intriguing "Public Opinion Surveys" a la Neal Donner at Venice beach? If the Macro approach appeals to you perhaps the superb work that Roger Bloxham, Dave Nolan and others are doing with Public Access TV might work in your community? Randy Grindle's effective crusade against City Hall and Urban Redevelopment might be a bigger bite than most of us want to chew but maybe polishing our personal communication skills in a Toastmasters Club would serve to start?

If your thing is the Micro 'grass roots' approach, Robert Poole's "Cutting back City Hall" is a virtual ready made blueprint for activism that can only incite an enlarged awareness in any community of non-libertarians. The micro activists "Bible" perhaps? Have you read it? If confrontation is not your thing, how about the following: a "Libertarian Lampoon" which gives rise to all sorts of juicy brainstorms. A "civic" interest class instructing community members in the mechanics of initiative, referendum, and recall, with Robert Poole's book as a text?

Seul Alinsky, in his book "Rules for Radicals" (which I heartily recommend for those who don't fear having their minds contaminated) gives a hilarious account of an Intended "Fart In" a way that illustrates that humor and doing what you enjoy are rules for; and a source of potentially effective activism.

Need activism be defined as grim and urgent confrontational drudgery only?

What about a parallel organization of Free Enterprise clubs with the Libertarian Pledge as it's liemotif and organized on an entrepreneurial model? It might draw Republicrats eager to learn how to make a buck and thereby learn the rudiments of Libertarianism in the process. Then there is a true Producers Union actually organized through the NLRB but stressing safety-training and the marketing of personal abilities and services rather than the traditional closed society legally limiting competition through force. These last would be much needed 'proactive' efforts instead of 'reactive' ones for which we are so often criticised. Must we merely react to issues and events sparked by others; or is taking the initiative a better approach?

The possibilities go on and on. Must

## STATEWIDE BALLOT GOODIES

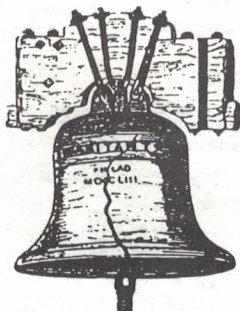
The California Ballot this November will have its usual heavy load of initiative questions - 27 statewide. Only 5 have the approval of the Libertarian Party of California.

18 either raise taxes, create taxes, spend money or authorize bonds. In the interest of fiscal responsibility we must object to more and more spending of the citizens' hard earned \$'s. Nine of the ten were added to the ballot 65 days after the deadline by the legislature. They will require a special voter pamphlet sent separately after you get your voter pamphlet. Without the text of the propositions available Ted Brown and John Vernon prepared arguments against all of the additional bond issues. *(If all of these bond issues are funded, it will nearly double the bonded indebtedness of the state in one single year; consider that everyone is incensed at the more restrained federal indebtedness tripling in only eight years.)*

The LPC supports these propositions:

- 127 - a tax exemption,
- 136 - restores Prop. 13 provision that taxpayers must be allowed to vote on any local tax increase as a part of the state constitution,
- 137 - requires a public vote before any change in the initiative or referendum process, 140 - the best of two terms limitation initiatives - "New Broom", and
- 141 - extends toxic waste provisions of Prop 65 to government entities.

Let your friends, family and co-workers know how we stand on these vital issues. Tell them the demorepublicans are selling their grandchildren down the river. Tell them by voting Libertarian they can bring about real change



## MORE FREE FORUM

A PROGRAM AVAILABLE FOR SHOWING IN YOUR AREA. Ted Brown, our candidate for Insurance commissioner, will be the featured guest on a "Libertarian Free Forum" segment scheduled for taping September 17, 1990. On the program, which is produced and distributed by Orange County Chairman, Roger Bloxham, Ted advocates a free-market alternative to the present system of compulsory auto insurance and fields questions from three other panelists.

## JIM LEWIS BEGINS TOUR

With the opening of college campus activity the Field Coordinator Project is again in full swing with Jim and the "Liberty Van" starting at Bakersfield and making their way up and down the state in this novel approach to bringing the Libertarian message to students, many of whom have never been exposed to anything but "Demopublicanism".

Last year Jim reached over six thousand students with the Nolan "Blue Diamond" Survey of political reference and found that 44% scored in the Libertarian quadrant!

Recently Jim and John Vernon spent a day at the Los Angeles Convention Center registering new citizens who had just taken the oath of allegiance. New Americans who had never before registered to vote in their adopted homeland. This is fertile ground for prospective Libertarians. Says John "I think these people are prime candidates for membership. I think they came here because they wanted Liberty. They have got to be terribly receptive to our message!"

## NOMINATING BY CONVENTION

On Oct 23, 1990, the United States District court in San Francisco will hear the Libertarian Party of California's complaint asking for the right to nominate our candidates by convention. Hours of hard work has been done by Ballot Access Chair Richard Winger to get us to this point. If hard work were all it took to win this important battle, we would have no fear of failure. Meanwhile, we will all have to wait and see how the judge rules. Rest assured that no stone has been left unturned in this legal battle. More in the next issue.

It's surely worth a try, but remember you must request absentee ballots, and mail them in promptly. When you're number three you have to try harder. Every little bit helps.

## ELECTION NITE SPOOF PARTY

The most *scintillating* Election Nite Party in LPC history will be held November 6, 1990.

Candidates, LPC officials and activists will gather at the Holiday Inn in Burbank. Along the I-5 at Olive Ave, the Holiday is easy to find.

Organizers plan to have closed circuit TV broadcasts spoofing the NES coverage of election results by covering all candidates except the Demopublicans.

Billed as the "Election Nite Party" for "No on all Bonds and almost everything else" this event should go far in convincing the media that we will not go away just because we don't get fair coverage on election night.

The proceeds from the modest charge of \$10.00 will be used exclusively for LPC outreach efforts. So get out your best duds and bring your cheeriest mood to the Holiday on election night.

## GUEST EDITORIAL

### Taking on the media

While Eastern Europe is finding political freedom in multi-party elections, the United States becomes more tightly locked into the two party monopoly by collusion of Democrats and Republicans with the media. Heading into another election we are once again confronted with absence of any mention of the Libertarian Party in daily newspaper, radio, and TV election campaign coverage. Political alternatives are hidden from the public.

The time has come to take on the media. I propose a letter writing, telephoning, picketing and leafleting campaign to challenge the media to support democratic elections. As a first step I urge you to watch news reporting for fair election coverage. Election reports about a particular office, rather than about an individual candidate, should mention all ballot qualified parties and their candidates. If not, write or call. Contacts should be non confrontational: tell them that you want to be informed about all candidates, not only democrats and republicans; ask whether they have been directed not to cover third party candidates; send information about our candidates.

Our message should be that the public is entitled to be informed about all candidates—freedom depends on it.

I suggest that we address our letters to the reporters with copies to their editor and publisher. If they get ten letters, they will notice; if they get a hundred, they will pay attention. If we can get non-libertarians to ask for fair reporting, it will help even more.

If we continue to be ignored as the election draws near we can target the office of a newspaper or station for picketing and hand out flyers voicing our grievance.

Letters to the Editor are, of course, always in order.

A very important point: news media get information largely from news releases.

If our candidates do not supply the information, we can't blame the media for not reporting on us.

So call your candidates first: ask them what news releases they have sent out.

### Media Visibility Plan

Do we have a legitimate gripe with the media for not getting coverage for Libertarian Party candidates? Not if our candidates don't supply the media with a flow of meaningful campaign news.

A media visibility plan to produce one news release per day during the last six weeks of the campaign can be easily achieved.

The California Libertarian Party has 6 statewide and 22 U.S. congressional; also 45 State Senate and Assembly candidates. If each statewide and congressional generates only two news releases of statewide interest, we can send out 56 releases. If each of our state Senate and Assembly candidates generate 2 releases locally, 90 more releases will be created.

If even half of our candidates follow this plan, the Libertarian Party will achieve daily media visibility. This plan distributes the effort - it should be easy.

Who will take us seriously if we cannot do this little?
